

Easter Decorations



SUPPLIES:

- 1 DIY panel art. 05265 from POPPY FABRICS
- Sewing machine and stitching thread
- Needle and thread
- Cotton filling
- Interfacing
- Ribbon
- 1x Fluffy pompon
- 2x Small seed cushion

INSTRUCTIONS:

- First cut out all of the parts, a seam allowance of 1 cm is already included.

GOOSE:

- Place two feet together on the correct sides, pin the edges and sew them together, leaving an opening for filling.
- Repeat for the other foot.
- Turn the two prepared feet correct side out and fill them with a little cotton filling.
- Stitch the opening. Then stitch the drawn lines with matching coloured sewing thread.



- Place the two body parts correct sides together, pin the edges and sew them together, leaving an opening for the feet, filling and turning.
- Fold the opening for the feet, place the two feet into the prepared goose and pin them in place.
- Turn the goose correct side out through the opening and shape it well. Fill the goose with enough cotton wool.
- To give the goose more stability, sew a small seed cushion from leftover fabric and put it inside the goose.
- Finally, sew the turning opening with a fine straight stitch.

- You can easily make a nice striped scarf from jersey or a nice bow from leftover cotton fabric.

- Stitch along the edges, leaving a gap of 5cm in the middle.
- Pin the ends and turn it to the right side. Give it a good press.
- Arrange the bow center with your fingers and use your needle and thread to wrap around the center.
- Pinch the ribbon in the middle and use the thread to wrap around both the ribbon and bow.
- Press the strip (5 x 7,5 cm) with the raw edges meeting in the middle and wrong sides together.
- Press it in half again. Wrap the middle around the bow and stitch the ends at the back.
- Stitch the edges of the final fabric (6 x 18 cm) correct sides together, turn around and stitch the opening.
- Make a loop to wrap around the wreath, stitch the loop.
- Your bow is now ready to attach. Just hand stitch it onto the loop.
- The wreath is ready and you can hang it with a loop, ribbon or string on the door.

BUNNY:

- Press interfacing on the wrong side of 2 ears, make sure it is centered.
- Add the other ear pieces correct sides together to the pieces with interfacing.
- Pin in place and stitch along the edges, leaving an opening for turning. Turn around and stitch the opening.
- Place the two body parts correct sides together, pin the edges and sew them together, leaving an opening for the ears, filling and turning.
- Fold the ears inward at the bottom to create a more playful look to the ears, place on top of the head and stitch.
- Turn the bunny correct side out through the opening and shape it well. Fill the bunny with enough cotton wool.



WREATH:

- Fold the fabric in half with the correct sides facing each other and sew. Leave an opening in the middle to turn and stuff.
- Sew the short sides so that the seam is in the middle.
- Turn the sewn parts using a stick.
- You will need approx. 35 grams of filling for each stitched part.
- Fill all 3 strips. Close the opening. Sew all three parts together.
- Make a braid.
- At the end of the braid, sew the three parts together again.
- Sew the two ends of the braid together. Now we have a wreath that we can further decorate.

BOW:

- We created a bow with a finished size of 15x23cm including the ribbon.
- Press the interfacing on the wrong side of the bow fabric (35,5 x 20,5). Make sure it is centered vertically.
- Fold the bow piece in half lengthwise and stitch along the long edges with 1 cm seam allowance.
- Press open the seam. Turn the bow to the right side and press the seam to the center.
- Fold the bow in half with the correct sides (non-seamed side) together. Stitch along the edges.
- Press the seam open and turn the bow to the right side. The seam will now be on the inside.
- Fold the ribbon (48 x 10 cm) in half lengthwise.
- Cut the ends at a 45 degree angle.





- To give the bunny more stability, sew a small seed cushion from leftover fabric and put it inside the bunny.
- Finally, sew the turning opening with a fine straight stitch.

- You can add a fluffy pompon as a tail and you can easily make a nice striped scarf from jersey or a nice bow from leftover cotton fabric.

GARLAND:

- Place 2 fabrics in the same colour correct sides together and pin the edges. Sew together, leaving an opening for turning.
- Turn around and stitch the opening. Repeat this for all eggs.
- It's optional to make a line from bias tape but you can also use a ribbon. Cut to size and attach the eggs.

HANGERS:

- Place 2 fabrics in the same colour correct sides together and pin the edges. Sew together, leaving an opening for a ribbon, turning and filling.
- Turn correct side out and fill with cotton filling.
- Add a ribbon at the top and stitch the opening.
- Now you can hang these fun hangers on an Easter branch.



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
